A long time friend of mine, Tim Sexton, is a co founder of the Make Good's Group who is sponsoring the temporary Oct 7–9th festival in Woodley Park and the Sepulveda Basin. Set up and clean up will last a few weeks. Based on his past involvements in the music and entertainment field, I think he can pull this off without any long term impacts to the park. Short term impacts such as trash, using recycled goods, creating traffic options, mitigating noise, staying away from the natural wildlife ponds, etc, seems to be addressed. Of course, I appreciate that you may have other concerns that may or may not have been addressed.

Although this might seem like an overwhelming music, arts and food gathering, the relatively short term impacts should be mitigated with the bond posted to restore any damage to the park to a pre festival condition. Perhaps some of the thousands of visitors will become aware of the recreational opportunities and the importance of the basin and will become supporters of its continued protection and the restoration of this unique resource.

I was told that a portion of the tickets sold will go to the LA Parks Foundation with 50 % of the proceeds going to the Sepulveda Basin.

Anyway, I wanted to let you know that I know and trust Tim to make good on his commitments if that is helpful in your final decision relating to this festival. If you have any questions, please let me know.
