Public Comment: Public Comments on Non-Agenda Items is limited to TWO MINUTES (2) per speaker. Time may be adjusted at the Chair's discretion. Public calling in, please press *9 on your phone to raise your hand to speak. For those that are using the Zoom Webinar please use the raise your hand feature to speak.

The amount of time for public comment on each agenda item is to be determined by the Chair at each meeting. Speakers shall limit their comments to matters relevant to the item on the agenda. The Chair may rule that the speaker is out of order if the comments are not germane to the item under consideration. If multiple requests for public comment are submitted on one agenda item, preference will be granted to members of the public who have not spoken previously during the meeting, either during general public comment or on another agenda item.

A member of the public wishing to speak on more than one agenda item at a single meeting shall limit his or her remarks to a total of one minute per item and five (5) minutes per meeting. Members of the public who want to speak on multiple agenda items for up to five (5) minutes at one time can choose to speak during the Multiple Agenda Items Comment period. Otherwise comments from the public on agenda items will be heard only when the respective item is being considered. Members of the public who choose to speak during the Multiple Agenda Items period will be given the opportunity to also speak during General Public Comment. Please be aware that time accumulates for any agenda items commented on.

Comments from the public on matters not appearing on the agenda that are within the Board's jurisdiction will be heard during the General Public Comment period. No individual speaker will be allowed more than two (2) minutes during General Public Comment, unless the presiding officer of the Board decides differently.

AB 361 Updates: Public comment cannot be required to be submitted in advance of the meeting, only real-time public comment is required. If there are any broadcasting interruptions that prevent the public from observing or hearing the meeting, the meeting must be recessed or adjourned. If members of the public are unable to provide public comment or be heard due to issues within the Neighborhood Council's control, the meeting must be recessed or adjourned.

Per the ENC Bylaws (Article V, Section 1D.1): "If at any Board meeting, a Representative who is absent either (a) has no designated Alternate or (b) has an Alternate who is also absent, then the president or presiding officer may, with the approval of a majority of the members entitled to vote at the meeting, designate an existing Alternate for any other Representative to serve and vote during the meeting in place of the absent Representative. - 9. New Business Funding Motion, Discussion and Vote may be taken on all items:
 - A. Outreach Committee:
 - 1. **ONEGeneration Senior Symposium 2022** This year, the ONEGeneration Senior Symposium will be on, Saturday, May 14th 2022 at the ONEGeneration campus. This will be like the event attended last year, which given the pandemic was well attended. The ENC has participated with a

booth at the event. MOTION: the ENC's Outreach Committee recommends that the board approve attending the ONEGeneration Senior Symposium, held on May 14th, 2022 at the ONEGeneration Campus and further requests \$\frac{\$1000 \text{ for a booth}}{2000 \text{ for a booth}}\$ at the event. Alex G. moves, Mike S. 2nds. Passed 4 (Y), 0 (N), 0 (A).

- 2. Senior Symposium Swag Should the Outreach Committee recommend purchasing a new item for the Senior Symposium? In the past, a big hit at the Senior Symposium was the credit card magnifiers. We can order new ones, colors are limited, perhaps in black with white writing for the event. Please see supporting document, CC Magnifier Image, to get an idea of what it looks like. The cost for 500 cc magnifiers, with setup and shipping comes to \$683.07, please see supporting document, Cost of CC Magnifiers. MOTION: The ENC's Outreach Committee recommends that the board approve spending up to \$800 for 500 credit card magnifiers from 4imprint. Each magnifier will have the ENC's name and website. The cost includes the setup and shipping. Alex G. moves, Jenny B. 2nds. Passed: 4 (Y), 0 (N), 0 (A).
- 3. Movie at the Park hosted by CD4 Councilmember Raman and the Encino Field Deputy, Kevin Sanchez-Morales would like to have a movie at the park event in May, this would be the responsibility of CD4 and the ENC will assist with promoting the event and be in attendance with a table, popcorn and handouts. We need to purchase new popcorn as our current ones have expired. Smart and Final has two 36 counts boxes for \$50.38. MOTION: The ENC's Outreach Committee recommends that the board approve spending up to \$60 for the purchase of popcorn kits to use in the ENC popcorn machine at upcoming movie at the park events from Smart and Final or similar. Alex G. moves, Jenny B. 2nds. Passed: 4 (Y), 0 (N), 0 (A)
- 4. Easter Egg Hunt at Encino Park RAP is requiring the Encino Community Center to host an egg hunt at Encino Park. The ENC has been invited to participate. We usually participate in the hunt at Los Encino but that is not occurring this year. Typically we have a table with some things for the kids, i.e. coloring. MOTION: The ENC's Outreach Committee requests that the board support spending up to \$275 for popcorn, coloring supplies and copies of images to be colored. The crayons, copies and popcorn may come from Office Depot (or similar). Alex G. moves, Jenny B. 2nds. Passed: 4 (Y), 0 (N), 0 (A).
- 5. Zoom license for the ENC With most pandemic restrictions being lifted, it is possible that some of board members may not want to meet in person and the Community Center requires proof of vaccination to enter (at this time) which may prohibit unvaccinated board members as well as members of the public who are not vaccinated. Additional considerations are who would be required to screen attendees and enforce the vaccine requirement. An idea has been introduced to have each NC purchase a Zoom license. Fees at this time are unknown but we have been given a price range 0f \$200 \$400 per year. To accommodate attendees, should the ENC prepare to purchase a Zoom license? MOTION: The ENC's Outreach Committee recommends that the board support purchasing our own Zoom license and allocating up to \$400 per year for the license. In addition, we request that the Finance Committee revise the operations budget to accommodate the new yearly charge as an operating expense. Alex G moves, Jenny B. 2nds. Passed 4 (Y), 0 (N), 0 (A).

B. Education Committee:

- 1. MOTION: The education committee recommends that the ENC approve a Neighborhood Purpose Grant for \$3000. to the Academy of Enriched Sciences PTA, to replace damaged outdoor shade canopies that protect children eating lunch and doing other school activities outside during the COVID-19 pandemic and to fix the school's marquee sign to include the owl scholar logo and STEM icon. Motion to approve: Jennifer Goldstein, second: Shelly Rivlin. Passed: (3-0)
- 2. MOTION: The education committee recommends the ENC approve a Neighborhood Purpose Grant to Portola Middle School for \$3500. for a student Mock Trial Program that includes instruction, teacher preparation, materials and a field trip to the Municipal Courts. Motion to approve: Jennifer Goldstein, second: Shelly Rivlin Passed. (3-0)

Discussion and Motion: The ENC Executive Committee recommends the addition of Standing Rule (Article VI, §2A, final sentence): The President will delegate or assume the duty of monitoring board member training compliance and verifying stakeholder status of applicants for vacant positions, and notify the Executive Committee of such assumption or delegation and any changes of assignment for such duties. Pat/Alex Passed 4 yes/0 no/0 abstentions)
- C. Parks and Environment Committee (Consent):
 - 1. Discussion and possible action: MOTION: The ENC Parks Committee recommends to the ENC Board that it support the Ventura Boulevard Cleanup with Volunteers Cleaning Communities on 4/23/2022 from 8:30 to 10:30 am by promoting the event on the ENC website, emailing and social media, and encouraging stakeholder participation and by authorizing the use of the Encino Neighborhood Council logo for any promotion of the event. Glenn/Katie passed 4 yes/ 0 no/ 0 abstentions.
 - 2. Discussion and possible action: MOTION: The ENC Parks Committee recommends to the board that the ENC present or co-present with other Neighborhood Council(s) a Town Hall on the proposed 2028 Olympic Venues in the Sepulveda Basin. Possible dates are the evenings of 4/26/2022 or 5/31/2022.

- Municipal Lobbying Ordinance: The City Ethics Commission is considering various amendments to the <u>Municipal Lobbying Ordinance</u>. One section pertains to Neighborhood Councils and would add verbal communications to the existing disclosure requirements. The proposed amendment wording is as follows: Proposed Section 48.11. Lobbying Disclosure – Communications to Neighborhood Councils
 - A. When a lobbying entity communicates, either personally or through an agent, with a Neighborhood Council or a Neighborhood Council member on behalf of a client, the lobbying entity shall disclose or ensure the disclosure of its status as a lobbying entity and the identity of its client.
 - B. For verbal communications, the disclosure shall be spoken at the beginning of the communication. For written communications, the disclosure shall be printed clearly, legibly and conspicuously.

The LA NC Coalition (LANCC) has voted to support this idea.

MOTION: The current Municipal Lobbying Ordinance Section 48.08.8 only requires lobbyist disclosure for written communications to Neighborhood Councils, so the Encino Neighborhood Council supports an amendment to the ordinance (proposed new Section 48.11 above) to include the same disclosure requirement when a lobbyist makes an oral presentation or verbal public comment to a Neighborhood Council that is related to their lobbying activities.
