- A. FOLAR Cleanup June 25<sup>th</sup>, 2022. The ENC is an event sponsor. - B. Fire Station 83 Ribbon Cutting June 26<sup>th</sup>, 2002, LAFD Station 83 open house/fund raiser combined with native garden ribbon cutting. The ENC has funded the native garden and has been supportive of the Station 83. We will participate in the ribbon cutting and would like to budget up to \$350 for hot dogs, condiments, buns, drinks, etc.... Possible MOTION: The ENC's Outreach Committee recommends that the board support spending up to \$350 for hot dogs, condiments, buns snacks and drinks, from Smart & Final, or similar for the June 26<sup>th</sup> native garden ribbon cutting and fund raiser at Fire Station 83 in Encino.
