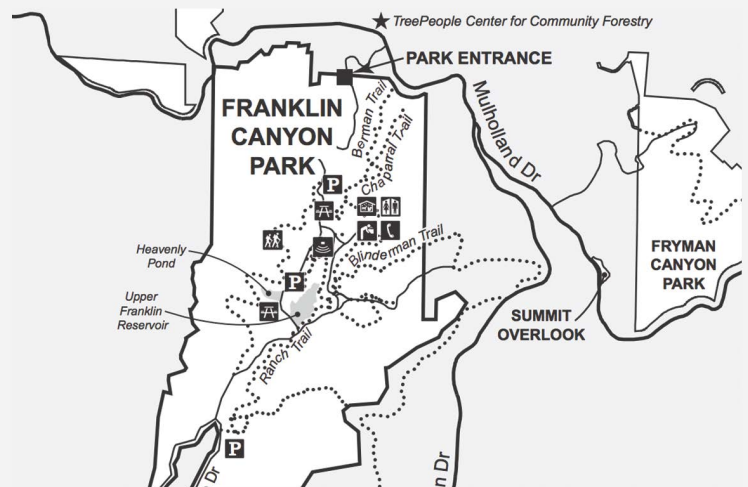

History: In 1914 William Mulholland and the Los Angeles Department of Water and Power began construction of a reservoir in Upper Franklin Canyon to distribute water brought from the Owens Valley. During the 1970's the Canyon was set for development when conservationist Sooky Goldman and Congressman Howard Berman encouraged the DWP and the National Park Service to make Franklin Canyon a park. The National Park Service purchased the Franklin Canyon Ranch in 1981 as part of the Santa Monica Mountains Recreation area. Today, the Mountains Recreation and Conservation Authority manages daily park operations.
