 - A. Planning for Public Safety Committee's Home Safety event.
 - *Event will be rescheduled due to delayed event approval from City. Options for new date are January 15 or January 22.*

 - B. Motion to provide up to \$1,000 for refreshments, supplies, support and outreach for CERT's 3rd Annual Encino Disaster Preparedness Drill on March 25.
 - *If anyone wants to be on the planning team, Zoom meetings are on the first Wednesday of the month at 2:00pm.*
 - C. Proposal to submit Community Impact Statement in support of the joint LAPD/LA City Attorney analysis, report and recommendations related to **CF 24-0390**. The report contains an analysis of existing state and local laws pertaining to street racing, takeovers and sideshows as well as potential modifications to these laws, which may assist in remedying and mitigating street racing, takeovers and sideshows.
 - D. Proposal to submit Community Impact Statement in support of **CF 14-1635-S10** which seeks to provide greater enforcement of Los Angeles' Home Sharing Ordinance (Airbnb & party houses). Currently the enforcement is very sporadic, rules are easy to skirt and penalties are not significant enough to be a deterrent.
 - E. Proposal to submit Community Impact Statement in support of **CF 24-1220** which seeks to create an ordinance that would prohibit the sale or distribution of nitrous oxide (laughing gas) in the City of Los Angeles. Nitrous oxide is a dangerous, addictive drug that is easily accessible in smoke shops and liquor stores and comes in flavored varieties.
 - F. Proposal to submit Community Impact Statement in support of **CF 24-1012** which requests a report of necessary resources needed to host gun buyback events at each LAPD bureau. Gun buyback programs are organized to reduce the number of firearms in the community by offering individuals the chance to anonymously surrender guns in exchange for gift cards.
 - G. Proposal to submit Community Impact Statement in support of **CF 18-0610-S3** which will establish a Right To Counsel Program. This is a homelessness prevention measure. According to

the motion, an estimated 30,000 eviction notices are filed annually in Los Angeles. When low-income subjects are unable to afford a lawyer, they frequently fail to contest the eviction notice, even if it's unlawfully issued, and subsequently lose their housing. The motion cites a report prepared for the city which found that for every dollar spent to help defend against low-income evictions, the city would save approximately \$3.48 because homeless are a great financial burden to the city.

- H. Proposal to submit Community Impact Statement in support of **CF 24-1269** which is a homelessness prevention measure. The motion requests a report for a framework to preserve affordable multifamily housing with Tenant Opportunity to Purchase Act (TOPA) and Community Opportunity to Purchase Act (COPA) policies. These policies give nonprofits and the tenants of affordable multifamily buildings the first option to collectively purchase their buildings and preserve the affordability levels of their housing. It also creates property ownership opportunities for people in low-income housing. Without these policies many of these units will no longer be affordable as rent stabilization covenants expire. This can result in tenant displacement and increased homelessness.

SB 411 Updates:

In the event of a disruption that prevents the eligible legislative body from broadcasting the meeting to members of the public using the call-in option or internet-based service option, or in the event of a disruption within the eligible legislative body's control that prevents members of the public from offering public comments using the call-in option or internet-based service option, the eligible legislative body shall take no further action on items appearing on the meeting agenda until public access to the meeting via the call-in option or internet-based service option is restored. Actions taken on agenda items during a disruption that prevents the eligible legislative body from broadcasting the meeting may be challenged pursuant to Section 54960.1.

(C) The eligible legislative body shall not require public comments to be submitted in advance of the meeting and shall provide an opportunity for the public to address the legislative body and offer comments in real time.

(D) Notwithstanding Section 54953.3, an individual desiring to provide public comment through the use of an internet website, or other online platform, not under the control of the eligible legislative body, that requires registration to log in to a teleconference may be required to register as required by the third-party internet website or online platform to participate.

(E) (i) An eligible legislative body that provides a timed public comment period for each agenda item shall not close the public comment period for the agenda item, or the opportunity to register, pursuant to subparagraph (D), to provide public comment until that timed public comment period has elapsed.

(ii) An eligible legislative body that does not provide a timed public comment period, but takes public comment separately on each agenda item, shall allow a reasonable amount of time per agenda item to allow public members the opportunity to provide public comment, including time for members of the public to register pursuant to subparagraph (D), or otherwise be recognized for the purpose of providing public comment.

(iii) An eligible legislative body that provides a timed general public comment period that does not correspond to a specific agenda item shall not close the public comment period or the opportunity to register, pursuant to subparagraph (D), until the timed general public comment period has elapsed.
