SECTION II - PROJECT DESCRIPTION

4) Please describe the purpose and intent of the grant.

Located along the Upper LA River, the Sepulveda Basin Wildlife Reserve is home to lush riparian habitat, over 200 local and migratory bird species, and an abundance of native and invasive flora. FoLAR's second Earth Month Habitat Restoration Day & Celebration will bring 400-500 volunteers to the reserve on Saturday, April 26 for a morning of habitat restoration and educational activities. Across 2 shifts, volunteers will spend 2 hours removing invasive vegetation like black mustard, and will then participate in educational activities like a nature walk, making native seed balls, hopping aboard our River Rover mobile museum, and exploring informational tables from partners. In partnership with CA Native Plant Society and San Fernando Valley Audubon Society, FoLAR volunteers will make an immediate, hands-on impact at the Reserve and learn firsthand how a healthy and thriving Upper LA River benefits River-adjacent communities like Encino, visitors to the River, and our urban wildlife.

5) How will this grant be used to primarily support or serve a public purpose and benefit the public at-large. (Grants cannot be used as rewards or prizes for individuals)

Our mission is to build capacity for communities, students, and future leaders to advocate for nature, climate, and equity on the Los Angeles River. By hosting a free, family-friendly event with multiple points of engagement on the River, we will both develop new environmental stewards and deepen current stewards' commitment to and understanding of the LA River. At this year's Earth Month Habitat Restoration Day & Celebration, we estimate that 400-500 volunteers will remove 15,000+ gallons of invasive plants, clearing approximately 1 acre of precious urban habitat at the Sepulveda Basin Wildlife Reserve. Removing this invasive vegetation at the reserve will reduce local wildfire risk, help decrease soil erosion into nearby waterways, and free up space for native habitat to benefit urban wildlife and park visitors. Through other educational activities like the nature walk or River Rover, Earth Month restoration volunteers will also increase their awareness of the LA River's many species, biodiversity, and ecosystems. This grant will partially cover the costs of audience generation, restroom rental, and event printing and supplies.
