A. Branded Pop-up Tent - Discuss options to approve up to \$1,500 for the purchase of an ENC-branded heavy-duty pop-up tent for use at community outreach events. The tent would provide a professional, visible presence while offering shade and a central space for engagement and materials. Options will include a durable, weather-resistant green tent, along with a branded table cover, pop-up banner, and/or feather flags for consistent use. This purchase would strengthen outreach efforts and enhance ENC's visibility at community events.

B. Collapsible Wagon Cart - Discussion and possible motion to approve up to \$150 for the purchase of a high-capacity, durable wagon to improve transport of materials at events and reduce trips. A sturdy, foldable cart with high weight capacity would support heavier supplies while enabling easy storage and transport, improving efficiency and reducing physical strain for council members and volunteers. C. Community Outreach/CIP: Seasonal Decorations - Discussion and possible motion to work with the Los Angeles Sherman Oaks/Encino Business Improvement District (BID) on a \$2,000 Capital Improvement Project (CIP) to introduce seasonal decorations along Ventura Boulevard, starting with the block between Amestoy and Louise, while working toward the future purchase of year-round decorative elements. This first phase would create an immediate visual impact in celebration of the 250th anniversary of the United States and help make the area more inviting, support local businesses, and build community pride. Decorations would be durable, reusable, easy to install, and stored at the Encino Neighborhood Council (ENC) office. Subsequent phases would expand decorations for additional holidays throughout the year, including, but not limited to: Fall, Halloween, Thanksgiving, Hanukkah, Christmas, and New Year's. In addition, the BID has approved a matching contribution of up to \$3,000 for holiday decorations within BID boundaries from Balboa to White Oak.

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In the event of a disruption that prevents the eligible legislative body from broadcasting the meeting to members of the public using the call-in option or internet-based service option, or in the event of a disruption within the eligible legislative body's control that prevents members of the public from offering public comments using the call-in option or internet-based service option, the eligible legislative body shall take no further action on items appearing on the meeting agenda until public access to the meeting via the call-in option or internet-based service option is restored. Actions taken on agenda items during a disruption that prevents the eligible legislative body from broadcasting the meeting may be challenged pursuant to Section 54960.1. **California Government Code Section 54953.8(b)(3).**

The legislative body shall not require public comments to be submitted in advance of the meeting and shall provide an opportunity for the public to address the legislative body and offer comments in real time. **California Government Code Section 54953.8(b)(4).**

Notwithstanding Section 54953.3, an individual desiring to provide public comment through the use of an internet website, or other online platform, not under the control of the eligible legislative body, that requires registration to log in to a teleconference may be required to register as required by the third-party internet website or online platform to participate. **California Government Code Section 54953.8(b)(5),**

A legislative body that provides a timed public comment period for each agenda item shall not close the public comment period for the agenda item, or the opportunity to register, pursuant to paragraph (5), to provide public comment until that timed public comment period has elapsed. **California Government Code Section 54953.8(b)(6)(A),**

A legislative body that does not provide a timed public comment period, but takes public comment separately on each agenda item, shall allow a reasonable amount of time per agenda item to allow public members the opportunity to provide public comment, including time for members of the public to register pursuant to paragraph

(5), or otherwise be recognized for the purpose of providing public comment. **California Government Code Section 54953.8(b)(6)(B).**
